




Goatee Beach

Eling Church on Eling Hill dates back to Saxon Days, although the original Church would probably have been a wooded structure. There are still small areas of the Norman Church visible, but much restoration work was carried out by Benjamin Ferrey in 1863 to 1865 which covered much of the older building.

There has been a mill on this site for 901 years. The mill was abandoned in the 1940's, however was lovingly restored between 1975 - 1980. It is now one of the only fully working and productive tide mills in the UK.
